| 22.041 | Black Lion pub – The Clerk reported that the potential buyer mentioned in January had withdrawn, but that Admiral Taverns have another potential buyer engaged in due diligence. The Council and parishioners present were cautiously pleased with these developments, and Harrogate BC Cllr Nick Brown noted that he would support continued use of the Black Lion as a hospitality business at district        |
|        | council level as long as that is the clear community intent. Admiral report that some basic cosmetic been done to the premises, but the Council was firmly of the opinion that the site remains an eyesore and that further work is necessary, whether the current potential sale is agreed or not.  |
