19.14	<b>Apologies</b> Apologies were received and accepted from ClIr Lawrence Paterson. Apologies were also noted from NYCC ClIr Robert Windass.

19.16	<b>Casual Vacancy</b> The council RESOLVED to co-opt Richard Littlefair to the vacant seat in Givendale ward. Cllr Littlefair then joined the rest of the councillors for the remainder of the meeting.		
19.17	Questions and Comments from members of the public / district and county councillors District Cllr Brown noted that the Harrogate Local Plan, currently in its final consultation phase, is being used to inform planning decisions, with 6.89 years' worth of land supply being contained within the plan. In response to a comment from a MoP, Cllr Brown noted that in the absence of any local plan allocation, no significant development within this parish would be approved in the foreseeable future, unless the community itself brought forward plans for community-led and/or affordable housing to meet an identified need. Cllr Brown asked for anyone inconvenienced by the teething troubles of either the new waste collection system or the Civic Centre switchboard to report them to himself. He finally noted that the Safer Neighbourhood Group had met in July, where small increases in crime generally and in rural crime had been noted, and that he intended to raise these issues at the district level in September.

	Receipts were noted for Reading Room hire (£280 in May, £120 in June, £64 in July), and £11,950 as		
	part payment of the WREN grant. The cash book balance after these transactions was noted as being 448.52, but it was also noted that a		
	further grant payment from WREN of £4,250 is due on 14 <sup>th</sup> August to assuage any cashflow worries.		
19.20	Speed limit		
	The council noted that North Yorkshire County Council has made an Order under Sections 84 (1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 applying a 30mph speed limit in various places around the parish, with six new signs installed and two replaced. Councillors welcomed this decision.		
19.21	Permissive paths		
	The Council noted the correspondence from Newby Hall Estate regarding permissive paths in the parish. Cllr Critchlow reported on various queries which he had passed on to the Estate and their responses as follows:		
	The Church Wood path is not designated as a permissive path, as its use would open the Estate to various issues of liability;		
	The path from Mulwith Lane to the River Ure is still valid, but could not be straightforwardly marked on the map circulated for reasons of scale;		
	The path from Back Lane, where it takes a sharp right to Moor Lane, is designated as a permissive path, but the Estate noted that there may not always be a pedestrian route along it, depending on the farming needs of the land at various times of year.		
19.22	Bank signatories		
	The Council considered whether to move its banking to Unity Trust Bank, whose products are tailored to the statutory and authorising needs of parish councils. However, the bank charges £6 per month for current account banking. The Council RESOLVED to bring this matter back to the October meeting. The Council RESOLVED that the signing arrangement for its HSBC accounts ****2825 and ****2833 shall be any two from Councillors Jane Mosley, Guy Critchlow, Richard Littlefair and Phil Tottie. <i>Action: This issue to be on the agenda for October's meeting</i>
