Black Lion Pub & Hub Update

We have already had share pledges of £140,000 which is a fantastic amount to achieve in just over 2 months. We clearly still have a lot of fundraising to do to achieve our £250,000 funding target.

What are the benefits for the village?

'More than a Pub' ... with everyone's help, the Black Lion will not just become a pub again, but a vital 'hub', providing other services and getting back a thriving community spirit in our lovely village. Potential ideas are, vibrant pub serving food, Café, Wellbeing Garden, Market Garden, Community Orchard, Additional Defibrillator, Essential Shop, Parcel Drop Off, Free Wi-Fi, Pop Up Health, Free Meeting Space etc

One thing that might encourage you to pledge or increase your pledge is that the share scheme may qualify for Social Investment Tax Relief (SITR) of 30% (to be confirmed).

There is independent research to suggest that house prices are adversely affected if a community loses their pub.

How can you help?

If you haven't pledged yet please return your pledge form to the small black post box marked 'Pledge Forms' inside the red telephone box called "Village Office" opposite the Reading Room. You can also pledge on our website www.skeltonblacklion.com/share-scheme. If you know people who haven't yet pledged, please encourage them. And if you have pledged already and could possibly increase your amount then please visit the website.

Don't forget that this is not a binding commitment and helps us gain a true reflection of potential investment in order for us to write an accurate business plan to apply for external funding.

You will be able to review the business plan and share prospectus before parting with any money once our official share scheme is launched.

Together we can help create an amazing community hub with a pub in the middle of our village!

School Closure Consultation

Whilst we fight to reopen the pub, we are now faced with the closure of our primary school in August 2023. Opened in 1856, it has served this village and surrounding areas for over 165 years.

Whilst pupil numbers in recent years have fallen, we believe there is an important case to keep the school open. The Parish Council has responded to the NYCC Consultation (full details on the noticeboard and online).

It is important as many people as possible respond by the deadline which is 24th February 2023.
